
Charles Upham is our most famous soldier, the only soldier to win the highest military award twice. Upham stated that he was just doing his job with his fellow soldiers, when he won the Victoria Cross in battles, firstly in Italy and then Egypt.

When winning his second medal for bravery on the battlefield, he was badly wounded and **captured** by the Germans. After they fixed him up he was imprisoned but Upham kept escaping. They sent him to their most escape-proof prison, 'Colditz'.

When he returned home people saw him as a hero. Upham just wanted to be a farmer, and so that is what he did.
