Near the end of World War One in 1917, kiwi soldiers came home with physical and mental scars. Some were given **confiscated** Māori land around the Whanganui River. The land was rough, with bush that needed to be cleared, but the men were used to hard work and were soon farming.

The soldiers and families were isolated. The government built a new bridge above the river in 1936 to help, but by cutting down the trees the

soldiers had caused many landslides on the few roads. They were more cut off than ever. All walked away from their farms, but the Bridge to Nowhere still stands.

2) In what year did the soldiers start to come home from World War One?

3) What caused the landslides to block the few roads to the soldier's farms?

4) What was the main reason the bridge over the Whanganui River was built?
