

Bang!



Objective

Through this game, students will learn to recognise and read numbers or recall basic facts.

Materials

- Paper Cup or similar
- Numbers or basic facts written out on cards (refer to sheet attached)
- 3 cards per cup with the word **Bang!** written on them

Method

- In pairs students take turns drawing out the cards from the can and try to read/answer them.
- If they can read the number or answer the basic fact correctly they get to keep the card.
- If the player can't name the number or answer the basic fact correctly, it goes in a "don't know it yet" pile in front of them on the floor.
- When a Bang! Card is pulled out the student who drew it has to return all their cards into the can. The Bang! Card is placed in a separate pile on the floor.
- The game is played until all the cards are drawn, and the player with the most cards, wins.
- The teacher or a designated person needs to practice with the child any cards that end up in the "don't know it yet" pile. Older children should write these into their books.

Variations

- Maths variations – Number Identification, Basic Facts
- Can also play with basic sight words, alphabet letters and contractions.
